Water may be poured into the font as the presiding minister gives thanks.





Was Paul crucified for you? Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? ¹⁴I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, ¹⁵so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. ¹⁶(I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) ¹⁷For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power.


LORD'S PRAYER



***WORSHIP NOTES:** André Campra was a key figure in the renaissance of French opera in the first half of the eighteenth century. He served as music director at the Cathedral of Notre Dame de Paris, and worked at the Académie royale de musique and the royal chapel at Versailles. *Rigaudon* – a lively French Provençal dance – is from the incidental music of Campra's opera *Idoménée*; a favorite of organists for many years, it is one of the pieces that inspired our Music Director's childhood desire to study the organ.

SANCTUARY LEARNING


With the new organ and redone chancel area, the worship committee has discussed the "look" and function of the chancel area space, considering long-term options. We often see areas within the sanctuary but do not always know what they mean. For the next number of weeks, enjoy some learning.

Baptismal Font

The place where the water is held when baptisms take place. Today the position of the baptismal font varies. It can be in one of three places: just inside the doors, in the nave in front of the congregation, or behind the chancel. In churches that usually administer baptism by pouring, the baptism font consists of a stand with a water basin on top. It could be a permanent structure in the front of the congregation or just inside the church doors, or it could be a portable structure that only appears when there is a baptism. In Protestant churches that administer baptism by immersion, the font is a large tank that is located in the front of the church, either behind the chancel or to one side.

Chancel

In churches with a <u>historic floor plan</u>, the chancel is the front part of the church from which the service is conducted, as distinct from the <u>nave</u>, where the <u>congregation</u> sits. The chancel is usually an elevated platform, usually three steps up from the nave. In churches with a <u>lecture-hall floor plan</u>, the term <u>sanctuary</u> is often used to mean both chancel and nave because the two are not architecturally distinct. In the historic floor plan, the words chancel and sanctuary are often synonyms.
